What can the school or district do to make 20m23s: sure that we're ready on our end so that when the jobs do come kids can go to 20m28s: school here and parents want to move here and they're not sending their kids to 20m30s: Mount Zion or Memorial foresight. That's what's happening right now. Anybody that 20m34s: has the resources is sending their kids out of this district and into ones of 20m38s: nearby if not the private school system. So what can we do to make sure that 20m43s: going forward? We're ready for when the jobs get here and people want to send 20m47s: their kids here. They want to move here. That's all that I have. If we don't have to worry about 21m58s: that right now, it means that that time will be returned to teachers and their 22m1s: students. So if that hasn't already happened in conversation with Izby, I <u>22m7s</u>: highly recommend that we get started on that now. So at this time, the school board, the DPS website 22m29s: hasn't been updated with Dennis information since the July 13th meeting and 22m35s: the school board updates are only available through links and the especially 22m39s: pertinent information like that the school, the start of school is being 22m43s: delayed multiple, multiple weeks. That's on slide eight out of 12. So unless 22m48s: you're being a really diligent reader, you're probably not going to see that 22m51s: information. And we certainly know that there are Dennis families and 22m55s: community members who do not understand the scope of what's going on right now. 22m60s: Additionally, no information has been sent directly to families or the 23m5s: neighborhood community about the timeline of the upcoming school year, 23m8s: which I'm sure will be under discussion tonight. And no information has been 23m11s: sent directly to families about how to navigate important upcoming events such <u>23m16s</u>: as kindergarten registration, which is happening on July 31st and would 23m19s: normally happen in the school building. As far as I know, we don't have a <u>23m22s</u>: school building right now, so it would be helpful if we could get some 23m25s: clarification on where we're supposed to go for that. And as far as updates go, 23m30s: Dennis families really need these to happen through both the mail and digital <u>23m34s</u>: mailing listings. Most of us are connected on classroom dojo. And so 23m38s: there are lots of really easy ways to get us information. And especially for 23m43s: Dennis families, this really needs to include updates on the progress and 23m47s: timeline of the academic year, especially for busing and childcare. Since most 23m51s: folks and we know our school, like Mark said, is primarily low income, this is 23m56s: going to be a real struggle for families. We also again need immediate updates on <u>24m1s</u>: kindergarten registration. And we also really need to know how the school <u>24m6s</u>: district will be providing classroom supplies and teaching materials since <u>24m10s</u>: they're all locked up right now. Thank you very much. Thank you. Amy Doberwick. 24m15s: Hope I said that right, Amy. 24m18s: I didn't. Okay. <u>24m22s</u>: Good evening, Mr. Cleventer, Dr. Clark and members of the School Board. I was present when an individual from the Kaia 25m20s: building declined to help assemble boxes during the recent packing of the <u>25m24s</u>: school. The exact comment was, it's not my job. I was shocked to say the least. <u>25m30s</u>: You see, I am a nurse. I am also in a management position. I would never ask 25m36s: my staff to do a job that I would not do myself. If I cannot do the job, then I 25m43s: should not be their leader. A good leader will lead by example. If central <u>25m48s</u>: administration and the school board cannot roll up their sleeves and do some 25m52s: physical labor, then you should not be the leaders of an already struggling 25m55s: district of overworked, stressed out teachers and support staff. Secondly, the 26m1s: staff were given very short notice. Many of them had plans were on vacation <u>26m6s</u>: already on vacation or maybe even working a second job to make ends meet. <u>26m11s</u>: Regardless of the situation, they were given five days notice and three days to <u>26m16s</u>: pack up. My daughter was lucky enough to get all of her personal belongings out 26m23s: before this happened, but some were not so lucky. They were also told that if <u>26m31s</u>: they packed everything up and labeled it, then the district would move it. Now <u>26m37s</u>: here we are three weeks later and at a standstill because an OSHA complaint was <u>26m41s</u>: filed against the conditions about the conditions in the building. You are <u>26m45s</u>: moving in modular classrooms and cleaning floors, repairing doors, hanging <u>26m48s</u>: hooks and shelves at a building that will be empty of chairs, tables, desks, <u>26m53s</u>: books, manipulatives and all the things teachers need and want to engage their <u>26m57s</u>: students. The OSHA complaint becomes a day late and a dollar short. The <u>27m2s</u>: environmental problems that exist in that building did not happen overnight. 27m6s: Teachers and support staff have been working at that building for years now 27m9s: and have already been exposed. This administration and board need to do the

<u>27m13s</u>: same thing I did during COVID, gown up, glove up, put on an N95 and get their 27m18s: stuff to the school. Lastly, I did mention that I'm in healthcare and 27m22s: management. I'm trying to recruit others to come to the area to work and you 27m26s: are making it very difficult. Supposedly there's a strategic plan with five <u>27m29s</u>: goals in place. Student experience, environment and support, staff recruitment, 27m35s: a good leader, FDR said that a good leader can't get too far ahead of their 27m40s: followers. All of you have forgotten and you are once the followers and you've 27m44s: left your followers behind. Nick, thank you. 27m59s: Good evening. My name is Nick Krim. I'm here to speak with you again about <u>28m3s</u>: Dennis Lab School. I'm sure by now you've heard about Dennis's connection to <u>28m7s</u>: the Monarch butterfly. If you haven't, ask one of the students. Most of them know 28m11s: the story. While the Monarch may be an underwhelming sports mascot, it certainly 28m16s: isn't as intimidating as a panther or a raider. It is part of the history of 28m20s: Dennis that students can be proud of. In addition to being the mascot for Dennis, 28m25s: the Monarch also has a deeper spiritual symbology in some cultures. Finally, as I wrote to all of you two weeks ago, bring <u>30m36s</u>: the second AP back to Dennis. And we're currently having modulars taken to the Garfield location <u>32m19s</u>: for Dennis K 8 to be all together at that site with 31 classrooms, including 32m26s: those modules combined. <u>32m29s</u>: Here are some important updates. I am still working with is be I have several <u>32m35s</u>: phone calls out to them as well as to the regional Office of Education. They're 32m40s: working with me as to what this could look like depending on when those <u>32m44s</u>: modules will be set up. So the goal is to have an answer for you within the next <u>32m49s</u>: week. I've just made another call today, hoping someone will call me back. But <u>32m54s</u>: there is nothing that I can do until I hear from them. There are my guide. Yes, there was a 33m9s: OSHA complaint. We had to follow guidelines with that OSHA complaint, which

33m18s: that they received our response to their complaint. And so now I'm asking, can we <u>33m23s</u>: at least go into the building and finish getting the items that we need? But we <u>33m27s</u>: need they're okay before we can do anything. <u>33m30s</u>: There was a question regarding extended day for Dennis, even though Dennis <u>33m35s</u>: will be at the Garfield location temporarily, there will there will still <u>33m39s</u>: be extended daycare there. There was a question regarding special education. 33m44s: Special Ed will still remain at the Steven Decatur Middle School site. The 33m51s: bell times tier three schedule updates for Stephen D. Persian and Montessori 33m56s: will have a shifting in times from 9 15 to 3 35 p.m. to accommodate all of the <u>34m2s</u>: buses that will be needed. <u>34m6s</u>: And you'll get more information from your building principles on that. As a 34m10s: reminder of how the site will be laid out. The first pink and blue that you're <u>34m15s</u>: looking at all of that is Steven Decatur Middle School. The powder blue is <u>34m20s</u>: where Garfield Learning Academy will be housed. The pink is the place where 34m26s: Steven Decatur will utilize the common areas will be worked out with the <u>34m30s</u>: building principles. So they will determine when kids go to PE when kids <u>34m36s</u>: go to lunch. Who is outside? Who is using utilize in the library? Those <u>34m40s</u>: things that comes from them. Not us in looking at the site where we're laying 34m46s: the modules. I'm trying to see if I can do that. Yep, here it is. This area right <u>34m51s</u>: here. These three areas here is where the modules will be located. If you drive <u>34m58s</u>: by, you will see that they are starting to put those things together. We have one 35m2s: unit that's there now. I'm told fingers crossed that within the next seven to 35m8s: 10 days, another one will be delivered if not sooner. They have been working very <u>35m13s</u>: diligently to get those additional modules in place. This area here is where <u>35m19s</u>: the playground will go. They've already broke ground for that as well. So they're 35m23s: trying to work simultaneously to get everything in place. Again, the room 35m28s: assignments will be based on the building administrator. So they will <u>35m31s</u>: determine who goes where in those modules. <u>35m38s</u>: Where are we so far? I'm not going to read all of this to you because it is on <u>35m43s</u>: the website, but you can see where we have completed some things a little bit <u>35m47s</u>: earlier than planned. And then the last thing that was added to this timeline <u>35m52s</u>: is number 10, which is the expansion of the parking lot. So I believe currently 35m58s: we have about 50 parking spaces, and I believe we need about 70 ish parking, 36m3s: maybe 75 parking spaces. So we will be looking at adding those additional <u>36m9s</u>: spaces as well. So we're probably looking at what's in the front as well as 36m13s: what's in the back of the building. <u>36m15s</u>: So some of the questions that have come up. How may these moves affect students? <u>36m23s</u>: Well, here are some of the cons adjusting to new surroundings, bus routes and <u>36m28s</u>: locations, adjusting to the new schedule, adjusting to staff, classroom set up <u>36m34s</u>: like a different seating chart, decor in classroom size. What are the and this <u>36m39s</u>: is for all of the changes, not just Dennis. Everybody is going to have to <u>36m43s</u>: adjust to something different. Okay, some of the pros, for example, all of <u>36m49s</u>: Dennis staff and students will be in a single location and they will have a <u>36m53s</u>: playground area. All grade levels will begin to see friends that they haven't <u>36m57s</u>: seen before, because they were in separate buildings. They'll be able to <u>37m2s</u>: engage more in their PBL activities at Dennis. Siblings, multiple siblings <u>37m7s</u>: that were in two buildings at Dennis will now be at one building. More <u>37m13s</u>: parent engagement because now they're not having to go to split their time <u>37m17s</u>: up to go to two different buildings. Instead of the principal going from <u>37m23s</u>: building to building, the principal will be on site. More peer mentoring because <u>37m28s</u>: I know Dennis mentions a lot of the upper grades working with the younger <u>37m32s</u>: students. The extended day is now in one location instead of two. And then the <u>37m38s</u>: staff will be able to work together more closely. <u>37m43s</u>: So the other thing that's come up, well, what about what's going on in my 37m48s: building? Well, right now we're in a crisis. And so we have to focus on the <u>37m53s</u>: crisis that is at hand. So this is just something that we just spoke up. It's <u>37m58s</u>: nothing on paper or anything like that. I just asked a question from BNG like, <u>38m3s</u>: Hey, what are some of the things that we're having to come back and revisit <u>38m7s</u>: when we're finished? And so we just, you know, called out a few things. So this <u>38m12s</u>: is not a complete listing. Their paperwork that's in 41m59s: their folders that tells them where Gray they're going to in the next company. 42m3s: Thank you. Cume folders. And I do try to be diligent in writing down not only your questions, 43m21s: but things that I hear out there. I do not remember that conversation. The 43m25s: minute I heard of this, I started acting. Okay. And have we, I know we talked 43m33s: about the master analysis that you just mentioned. Have the other schools been 43m36s: checked yet for any structural compromises? No, that's what I want. So 43m42s: that hasn't been done yet, but we're in the process. Right. That's what I want <u>43m44s</u>: the board to think about. That's exactly what I'm going to bring to you at our <u>43m47s</u>: next board meeting to get permission to move forward with all of that. And it 43m51s: will be, will it be the same? I guess engineering firm that checked the two 43m58s: dentists? Because I know we had two different firms that did those. Is it 44m2s: the one of those firms or is this a different independent? I don't know 44m5s: for sure. I don't know if this firm can do all the things that I guess that was 44m10s: a cue. Sorry. Thank you. So we'll have to do a procurement professional <u>44m16s</u>: services. We'll have to reach out to structural engineering firms that are 44m20s: on record and anyone else in the state that can provide that. So that's going 44m23s: to be coming to you guys soon enough. And then from that, you'll have to 44m27s: interview at least three and then select one. So it could Oh, so it's like a 44m31s: whole new whole new thing. I can't just continue from the previous. Okay. Okay. 44m37s: Thank you. You're welcome. 44m41s: Will this engineer report not only have structural but also provide the 10 <u>44m44s</u>: year inspection as well at the same time? That's okay. Sorry. 44m52s: No, the 10 year health life safety is something that will be on the agenda 44m55s: for the eighth. And that currently is going to stay with BLDD with that <u>44m58s</u>: initial on the eighth, the initial proposal on the eighth. The structural <u>45m3s</u>: analysis will come from an outside company.

45m8s: So in the event that these teachers cannot get their personal belongings out

45m13s: of these classrooms, let's say ever, do we have a plan in place for that? 45m18s: Any kind of like reimbursement or is that something we need to talk about in 45m22s: the event that these buildings are deemed unsafe permanently or something? I <u>45m26s</u>: think that's something we'll need to talk about if that happens. But I don't <u>45m29s</u>: believe it will. I believe that they will allow us back into the building at 45m33s: some point in time. I think they just need to be clear that we had a plan in 45m38s: place that we were following. And they just need to hopefully recognize that 45m43s: the plan is a safe plan and will allow us back in. 45m48s: Do we know how long it's going to take to clear the OSHA complaint? I have 45m51s: legal working on that right now. 45m57s: Any other questions? Any comments on other subjects? 46m3s: We'll move on to our roll call action items. Do we have a recommendation for 46m6s: the personnel action items? Yes, I recommend the Board of Education 46m10s: approve the personnel action items listed in the memo from Deanne Hillman, 46m15s: Interim Director of Human Resources and the Human Resources Department as 46m19s: presented. Oh, motion. So moved. Sucker. Any discussion on this item? 46m28s: Miss Bradford. Dr. Collins Brown. Hi, Mr. Scheider. Hi, Mr. Wetzel. Hi, and <u>46m33s</u>: Mr. Clevenger. Hi, for I zero nade three absent. Motion carry. 46m39s: Thank you. Do we have a recommendation to accept an award general contractor bids 46m43s: for the new K eight magnet school building? Yes, I recommend the Board of 46m48s: Education accept an award general contractor bids for the new K eight 46m52s: magnet school as presented. 46m55s: Motion. So moved. 47m0s: I'll second, but I have a couple of questions. Yeah, okay. I just want to 47m4s: go ahead. Okay. So I'll second it for now. Just question. My concern is these 47m8s: are just bids. These are this is not the actual firm or this is the firm that 47m12s: we're trying to approve right now. I'm going to have thank you. I just 47m16s: This is the firm. This is the firm. I just want to make sure because I had a 47m20s: question if this was the firm. This is the award that tonight you'll be 47m24s: awarding the word to the two that's what I thought firm at hand. Sorry to 47m29s: interrupt you. Apologize to that. So can we talk about this firm like where 47m33s: they're from and why we chose this firm? Yeah, we'd like to we'd like to have 47m38s: Steve Oliver from BLDD architects come up and give us a little refresher 47m44s: where we've been. You hear me? Okay. And where where we're proposing to go 47m47s: here. Yeah. So good evening. So as just answer a few questions, we've 47m51s: completed the competitive bidding process for the new K eight magnet 47m54s: school. And so for those of you not familiar with that, that's this case 47m58s: was about a five week process where it gives general contractors and their 48m1s: subcontractors a chance to get familiar with the project and us answer 48m5s: questions, give clarifications them to get bids from their subcontractors and 48m9s: suppliers. So that process has been completed. This is a competitive 48m13s: process where we had four general contractors that submitted bids that 48m18s: ranged a low of just under 25 million to a high of just over \$30 million. Our <u>48m24s</u>: estimate, which you've seen in your board packet was just over \$20.8 48m27s: million. So we were very excited about the bid results. The low bidder we 48m31s: have checked out. They're good with their bids. They have met the mb 48m35s: requirements actually exceeded them by almost 5%. They're a firm out of 48m39s: Champaign, Illinois that we're familiar with. In fact, we recently did a new 48m43s: school for us. The International Prep Academy in Champaign. It was about a 48m47s: 78,000 square foot facility, new facility that actually toured with some of 48m51s: the district facilities. Kent Metzger and Rita toured that with us as well as 48m55s: Ray Fry. So it's it's a firm that's very capable of doing this. Again, we're 49m1s: very excited about the bid results because it's might be where this is a 49m4s: very difficult bidding climate right now. There's a lot of work out there. So <u>49m9s</u>: to get four bids on this size project is good. The Sangamon County <u>49m14s</u>: markets, especially saturated right now, there's a ton of work going right <u>49m17s</u>: there. So that I think prevented even more bidders from bidding the project. 49m21s: So we were very pleased to see this came in about \$3.8 million under our <u>49m25s</u>: estimate. So there were two bids that were above our estimate two below it. So <u>49m30s</u>: we felt really good about that. So just to clarify for the public when you 49m35s: said the they met the MBE. MBE goal requirements set by the district. Could 49m41s: you just clarify what that is for the general public, please? Sure. And I you 49m45s: know, I know you have a consultant that has that. So let me find that paragraph 49m49s: here. I think there was a letter of recommendation in your board packet 49m53s: from Fred Coleman. Yeah, so basically what are the initials mean? Yeah, that's 50m1s: the CAI letter. No, the MBE. Oh, I'm sorry. Yeah, the minority business 50m6s: enterprises. So the goal is 15%. Okay. Bruno Russo, who is the apparent low 50m10s: bidder that is being recommended tonight, came in at 19.21%. Okay. And were 50m15s: there any firms or contracts, contract companies from Decatur? Christie 50m21s: Foltz. Did they meet the MBE? If you're allowed to share that. Yeah, I don't 50m28s: recall the UQM. I don't know that we analyze that because in a competitive 50m31s: market, basically you're forced to go with the low bidder, the low apparent low 50m34s: bidder. That being the top priority, what you're saying. Part of that being the 50m41s: top priority as long as they meet the minimum MBE percentage. So and that's a 50m45s: goal. Keep in mind that's excuse me. That's a goal for this. It's not a

50m48s: requirement. Right. Okay. So we're required to go with the lowest bid, even 50m51s: if it's not a local company. You are correct. And when we can't make an 50m56s: exception for anything ever, even if it's because I just I'm a little 51m1s: disappointed that it wasn't a Decatur firm because that would be more 51m4s: community involvement and you know. Yeah. With public funds like this, you're 51m10s: really forced unless there there is something wrong with their bid to go 51m13s: with the low bidder. 51m18s: Steve, could you also give a little overview? The portions of the project 51m24s: that have already been let and are out right now have been have been put in 51m31s: motion that purchasing process has been put in motion. Could you kind of give 51m35s: us a grand total of where we are? Yeah, so grand total. So if you recall, we've 51m40s: already procured the precast exterior wall package as well as some materials 51m45s: like electrical switch gear, main distribution panels and the chillers. 51m48s: Those are a long lead time items. So we procure those early so that it could 51m52s: meet the overall project schedule. So all in project budget, including a 51m57s: construction contingency of 5%, which is a prudent way to approach this 52m0s: project, including furniture, fees, all soft costs. You're just under 33.5 52m6s: million dollars total project budget. The original estimate for that was just 52m10s: over \$37 million. So it's about three and a half million dollars under the 52m14s: total project budget all in. 52m16s: Thank you. Any other questions? When will this be completed? The goal is it 52m23s: would be completed by the end of 26, excuse me, 25, because we're using 52m30s: ESSER money and so there's need to be allotted by that time. So this point 52m34s: that schedule is part of the contract as well. Any other questions? And this 52m42s: coming to the special meeting was just a sense of timing. It is. Okay. Actually, 52m47s: I thought it was the end of 24. December 24, I thought. Yeah, you said something 52m54s: about January 25. January 25. Yeah, January 25. The idea of the July board 52m58s: meeting was supposed to be today at some point in time. So the bid 53m2s: documents had this week as the awarding. So that's why we had to have the 53m6s: special meeting. Yeah, the goal was to expedite this to get the contract or 53m10s: mobilize as quickly as possible to hit that target. So I'm sorry. It was 53m14s: January of 25 is what the target is. Thank you for that clarification. <u>53m20s</u>: Thank you. Thank you. Appreciate the update. 53m24s: Mr. Bradford. Mr. Wetzel. 53m27s: Hi, Dr. Collins Brown. No.

53m32s: Mr. Scheider. I and Mr. Clevenger. I three I one a three absent motion 53m38s: carry. Thank you.
